

OBITUARY: WALKER H. BIGELOW, EX-RAILROAD EMPLOYEE | Buffalo News, The (NY) 15 August 1989:

A funeral for Walker H. Bigelow, 87, a retired railroad claim agent, will be held at 3 p.m. Wednesday in the Ullrich Funeral Home, 855 Englewood Ave., Town of Tonawanda.

A Buffalo resident for 70 years, Bigelow died Sunday (Aug. 13, 1989) in his home. Burial will be in Forest Lawn.

Bigelow retired in 1966 after working 48 years for the Delaware, Lackawanna & Western and the Erie-Lackawanna railroads.

Active in Masonic circles, he was a member for 66 years of Parish Lodge 292, for 63 years of the Buffalo Consistory and for more than 50 years of Ismailia Temple. In addition, he was a past president of the Erie-Lackawanna Square Club and the Rail Road Transportation Square Club, both Masonic-affiliated organizations.

For the last 15 years, the Silver Springs native served as a volunteer at the Veterans Hospital. He was a trustee of the former White Memorial United Methodist Church for 25 years and served as the church's financial secretary for many years.
